






Because I start with the old posts :) Along the way, I am fixing things, improving it. I still have plenty on my todo list, but already happy with having learned [Font Awesome](#), which makes it easy to annotate with how I fixed broken links (or not). I now use three icons: a box for when I use the Internet Archive (they can use your donation); a 'recycle' icon when I found a new URL for the same page; and a broken URL link for other situations.
