Test users found a problem on Google's [Chrome](#) browser, and Rich then [did something](#) that is only possible in an Open Source environment: he downloaded the buggy product (Chrome), started looking for the cause, found it, and filed a [detailed bug report](#). Just think that would have happened if this problem was in MS Internet Explorer...
